



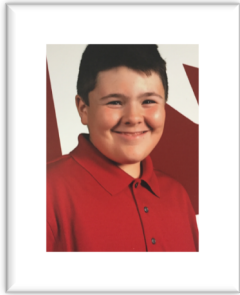
MY GRANDCHILDREN

Emily

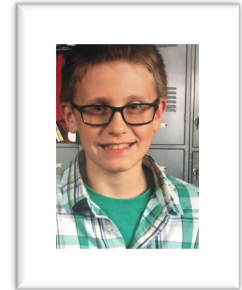

she brings them to me. She sings like an angel.

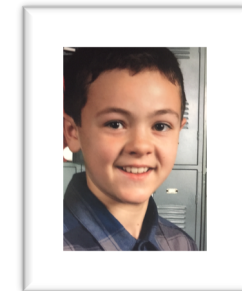
Ben
